WHAT IS "OPIOID STEWARDSHIP"?

The judicious prescribing and disposal of opioids within an institution by identifying, reducing, and managing opioid misuse and their resultant unwanted outcomes among the patients. - American Hospital Association

A series of strategies and interventions involving the appropriate procurement, storage, prescribing and use of opioids, as well as the disposal of unused opioids when opioids are appropriately prescribed for the treatment and management of specific medical conditions. The goal of opioid stewardship is to protect and optimize individual and population health. Specifically, the goals are to ensure the rational use of opioids: meeting the needs of individuals who require pain control, while minimizing harms to the individual and to other persons and populations. These harms include those that may arise from opioid overuse, misuse and diversion. - World Health Organization



CDC Clinical Practice • Guideline for Prescribing Opioids for Pain

Recommendations grouped into four areas:

- 1. Determining whether or not to initiate opioids for pain
- 2. Selecting opioids and determining opioid dosages
- 3. Deciding duration of initial opioid prescription and conducting follow-up
- 4. Assessing risk and addressing potential harms of opioid use
